Attached are two recent student evaluations for Eco 250: Economic and Business Statistics I—an introductory business statistics course at UNC Greensboro. The Undergraduate Bulletin 2012-13 at UNC Greensboro describes the course as “[an] introduction to statistical methods with applications in economics and business. Topics include descriptive statistics, probability, statistical inference, correlation and regression. Emphasis [is] on problem solving with microcomputer applications.” Taken from my syllabus, the course objectives are listed below:

By the end of the semester, [students] should be able to:

- 1. Understand sampling methods, sampling distributions and the Central Limit Theorem.*
- 2. Calculate and interpret common measures of central tendency and dispersion and be able to determine the presence and direction of skew.*
- 3. Use probabilities and probability distributions to assess the likelihood of events.*
- 4. Estimate parameters of common discrete and continuous probability distributions.*
- 5. Calculate and interpret confidence intervals for population means and proportions.*
- 6. Perform hypothesis tests and understand the consequences of errors in tests.*
- 7. Estimate and interpret simple linear regression and make predictions.*

In addition to the above, an important objective of this class is to learn to use Microsoft Excel to do statistical analysis.

Lastly, the student evaluations appear in reverse chronological order and the last page documents the rating system.

Subjectives

1: Comment on the effectiveness of the instructor's classroom presentation and subject matter organization.

Strict but efficient

The instructor's classroom presentation was always organized. Information was always clearly stated and presented as described on the syllabus. Fused topics seemed to relate well and at times made the subject easier to understand.

I took a statistic class before, and this the worse class of my semester. I am doing good in the class but not because of the professor, but because of my own effort after class. To me there is no point to come to class if

the teacher will be reading the slides and reading his lab instead more example on the board and real practice.

The power points and the files on blackboard were extremely helpful. They were clear and concise.

The course material was presented in an organized manner, though I wish his long term pace was a little better. A day and a half for linear regression at the end of the course didn't seem nearly adequate compared to the time spent on other, just as difficult topics such as hypothesis testing.

The powerpoints and excel notes were extremely helpful for both homeworks and quizzes

The instructor used blackboard for his instruction. I would like see in the future, if an instructor does not use the course book during class, don't ask students to buy the book. A lot of time the book is confusing and just reading it on your own isn't helpful. If say to buy the book, then you should use the book in class. This will help a lot of students bank accounts.

I thought it was done fine.

He's very effective and efficient in his teachings.

Professor Rhodes was a great instructor. In order to fail this class then the student has to do absolutely nothing. Professor Rhodes provided us with all sorts of extra help that was easy to understand. I really like the excel help files, especially the labs, and I also liked the Illuminate Lectures. Professor Rhodes knows that as students, as soon as we get home we forget everything that we've learned so he's provided us with a butt load of materials that makes sure we can complete the work at home too. There's so many things that I enjoyed about this class but for the sake of time and the fact that I know you don't want to read all this I'm going to stop ranting about his Greatness... in conclusion professor Rhodes Rocks!!

The instructor teaches primarily from powerpoint slides and excel spread sheet labs. This is kind of difficult because while all the information is there, which is great. Students don't really see the process because it has already been laid out. For this reason its easy to "understand" the material, but not really be able to do it well on your own.

The overall class organization is fine. The only critique I have is that the exams are administered much later than the material is covered in class, and after relative homework assignments are due. This made it more difficult to keep up on new material while going back to study past material. This isn't completely the fault of classroom organization, of course, but I propose that having exams more immediately following the end of the last section covered would facilitate better preparation.

Mr Rhodes speaks clearly and loud enough but does not engage the students enough. His handwriting self-admittedly is not the best but he does provide good clarification with his examples. He presents the material in a well organized and clear manner.

Overall, the material is very difficult, as expected. The organization of the lectures, homework/exam schedules is very clear and consistent. The only major issue I had with this class was with how fast the professor went through the lectures despite the difficulty of the material. At times, I felt we were just reading the slides and they skipped around where it was easy to lose your place if you were following the lecture powerpoint with a print out of it or on your own computer.

more hw to prepare for test

Prof. Rhodes is very organized and presents the information in a logical order. The subject matter is dry and short of turning his lecture into a stand-up comedy act there is not much one can do to improve the presentation.

The instructor always was very organized and made sure we had more than enough material to help us with this difficult course.

Everything we needed was provided, and Excel help was very helpful.

He gave us all the information we needed.

I think he needs to make his class more interactive, instead of lecturing the entire class period.

2: Comment on the difficulty of the course material...

Assignments are easy if you pay attention in class

There's no doubt that the material for this course was hard but Professor Rhodes tells you that from the beginning. Nothing came as a shock to me in this class, everything that happened to me in this class was expected because Professor Rhodes told me it was happen. This is a Stat class, the material is difficult. Students really don't encounter this kind of material in other classes. The instructor does provide a lot of resources within the course to aid students that are willing and wanting to learn outside of class. The excel labs are really helpful. The work load is not to bad. The homework assignments are good practice and the quizzes are short.

The difficulty is probably what it needs to be, challenging enough to require much time investment, but still within the boundaries of reason. This is especially true given the level of difficulty I imagine for Stats 2.

The course was difficult but Mr Rhodes provided ample documentation beyond the textbook to clarify the material. I would have like to have had some more quizzes and homework assignments (non-graded) to work, outside of the ones that were graded so that we could have further practice doing the work ourselves instead of just reviewing examples and the work we had already completed.

The course material was relatively difficult, but the instructor gave supplemental readings, help files, and videos to help further explain material. I found the supplemental videos to be very helpful when doing the homework assignments. I would have liked to have had some additional problems to work or possibly a practice test to give me more practice before the exams. For example, I found for Exam 2 that I was confused on exactly which probability formulas to use, so I think if I seen more examples of each it would have been more clear to me.

The course material was extremely difficult, but I thought the labs were very helpful.

3: Comment on the grading/grading procedure...

Grading is fair

Assignments were graded fairly. It was nice to be able to compare our answers to the correct answer and see an explanation of the correct answer. We were also allowed to go to the instructor's office to l ask him any questions.

the grading is fair enough

I believe the exams and assignment were graded fairly and allowed you to see exactly how to work each problem out.

Grading was mostly fair and accurate. I did find some problems with the connect system. On at least one occasion, it stated that I had a less than perfect score, but then said I didn't miss any questions.

I thought the grading procedure was very fair and the instructor gave explanation for each exam, in detail, in a timely manner.

This grading procedure is fair, a graded return of the exams, homeworks & quizzes was given right away because they were online. The test grades were not explained in any further detail unless asked or met with the professor outside of class. I did like the fact that you could see each question and the work to the correct answer after the exam had closed and on a separate given document on blackboard, but it didn't really do anything if you didn't understand the question in the first place.

Yes, Prof. Rhodes was very efficient in grading things in a timely manner.

The grading procedure is fair. I knew from the first day of class what he expected. He always got assignments back in a timely manner and test are also always adequately explained.

4: Did the instructor generate interest in the subject and stimulate your intellectual curiosity?...

You could tell that Professor Rhodes took interested in the subject because he put a lot of time and effort into making sure that we took interest in the subject as well. There was respect and understanding between the instructor and the students.

I would say that the instructor is obviously passionate about the subject. I'm not really sure if that rubs off on the students. I think that the instructor made attempts at giving examples that might interest students, however more could be done. The instructor could through out more open ended questions and allow students to participate more, which would demonstrate understanding. Instructor seems dedicated to want students to succeed, however he really isn't interested in helping students that don't want to put in the work to help them selves. Which is understandable.

As far as statistics can be interesting or exciting, the instructor provided stimulation and allowed for questions not related directly with the materials on hand. The application to future careers and everyday life was emphasized throughout the semester, which I find important.

I definitely had respect for the professor; there were clear and established guidelines on the course itself and also on the expected behavioral standards.

I feel the instructor did great at explaining and providing an abundance of helpful materials for us to use. The only thing I would have liked to have in addition would have been some hands on problems we could have done in class as we were going over the material. I think this would have helped me especially when it came to doing the homework on Connect.

The instructor is very interested in the subject he teaches, yet it isn't taught in a stimulating way. The lectures were hard to sit through at times, but I'm not sure how they could have been made exciting in anyway, either.

There was an atmosphere of mutual respect, the instructor made it clear how he wanted the classroom to be conducted and what he did and did not like, and what he would and would not accept.

I do not enjoy the subject matter nor do I have a desire to be employed in a career that involves generating this data. The instructor provided more than enough resources should I ever decide to interpret raw data though. I did learn how to interpret it and have a better idea of what questions to ask when presented with data. This course taught me how to spot skewed surveys & results and to look deeper than the surface value into what is really being presented as well as what has been left out.

The instructor did try and stimulate interest in the subject, but economics is not for everyone. The instructor did want us to learn the course material. He always went over the material and a lab showing how to complete the assignments and work in excel.

The subject is boring and he made it fun.

I honestly don't think the instructor was interested in the subject matter. The atmosphere was mutually respected because the instructor made clear of the rules in the class prior before the class started.

The instructor was very well versed in his subject matter and by doing this he was able to teach the course in a good manner. I think his rules of the classroom were the strictest I have ever had in any class I have taken. You could not show up a second late for class or he would get extremely upset and send you out. I think this is a little overboard, but the strictness meant that he really cared about you being on time and learning the material.

I don't really like economics, so I just did what I had to do to get a good grade in the class. The teacher did thoroughly explain the material though, so students were able to understand fairly easy.

The instructor did generate an interest in the subject and definitely stimulated my intellectual curiosity. 5: Please give your thoughtful evaluation of this course as an educational experience...

From taking this course I have learned a lot about basic economic principles. The instructor provided us with a lot of resources to use during the course which were very helpful in learning some of the harder material. The course work was very hard after the first test and sometimes I wasn't able to devote enough time to fully grasp all of the material. I didn't really feel like the homework or quiz properly prepared me for the test because when it came time to take the test I was confused on a lot of the problems. Overall I think the professor was great but the course work was really hard.

This class can easily be boring and not help the student. if the teacher can make the lectures more like an exchange with student. A little bit more of "this is how you do it" with more than 3 examples, than just long wordy explanation with instruction on the LAB will help more. he can even have students work on assignment in-class to evaluate where are the difficulties.

Overall i thought the instructor broke down what each term meant very well and showed us the exact way to apply each formula. I would recommend doing more examples in the classroom to make sure we fully understand.

Units. It's been very hard to keep track of what's a probability vs. what's a std. deviation. Coming from a scientific background, the lack of units mentioned has been very frustration, and confusing. Null Hypothesis. What is it? I don't think it was adequately explained what it is, and how it relates to the overall problem being evaluated. Questions. His teaching style doesn't lend very well to questions. I noticed that some people (including me) would raise their hand for a question, but the instructor wouldn't notice for an extended period of time, so the question was never asked. When a question or clarification was asked, usually the answer was repeated in the same wording as during the lecture, which didn't seem to help much. I wish that the instructor would take a second and reword the concept, to make it easier for those who don't think like him to grasp said concept.

You definitely know the course material better than any student and that shows in the all the help the modules give

This is a statistics class, he would show how to do the work on PowerPoint, I think it would be better to teach with excel.

I learnt a good amount in this course, but it was not "fun".

The instructor should go over the homework in class and not give any quizzes

The day that Professor Rhodes used the Calories of Egg McMuffins in an example was the day I knew that I needed to be in this class. He was the first teacher that could make an incredibly hard course easy to understand. The trick is to incorporate examples with food in it and every student will get an A.

The course provides students with everything they need to know for this level of stat. However I do feel the material could be taught better. Having questions already solved on the board does not allow students to really understand, it just guides them through the problem. I think this course has mistakenly substituted guided lectures for what the student actually need, which is instruction.

I am very glad that there was such an abundance of materials provided through blackboard. It was a little difficult to figure out the organization of all the materials at first, but over time I was able to quickly find the information I needed.

Overall this was a very challenging course but it was a very fair course with plenty of resources to help the student succeed. The instructor was straightforward and consistent through out the semester. He was very helpful in answering an questions that students had and clarify any misunderstandings. A suggestion for improving the course would be to engage the students more, he knows the material and the subject very well but I believe it would be beneficial if he addressed the students more often when going through the power points instead of having his back partially turned (it was basically fully turned for those on the left side of the classroom).

I enjoyed the class and the instructor. I felt he gave us an abundance of information, but I would have liked more problems and examples to be worked during class to help me since I am more of a visual learner.

I thought it would have been helpful to have more word problems in the homework and practice problems. Most of the test questions were word problems, and I didn't think I had enough practice with them to feel comfortable answering those questions on the exams.

Overall, I can't say that I enjoyed this class and I'm not sure why that it is included as a part of the CARS major. I found that the material is VERY difficult and regardless of how hard I tried, I still haven't done as well as I wished to do, even being that this is the second time I have taken the class because of the difficulty. As far as this section and professor, I don't have any further advice on how the course could be improved, it's probably as good as it's going to get in general.

I would have preferred more examples be worked together in class. The Labs written by Prof. Rhodes and the lectures dealing with them were the most engaging lecture periods. The how to's and why's of what is covered in class via the power points could likely be integrated into the hands on portion of the Labs.

He really has put a lot of time in this course and making sure we have enough information to help with this difficult material. He went above and beyond most of my other professors with the amount of helpful documents for the students to use. This course is hard and needs a professor dedicated to helping the students like Mr. Rhodes.

The course material was hard, but everything was graded fairly and lecture was great.

He was a great teacher, always gave us a lot of information with great detail.

I have learned a good deal in this class. I think overall, it was a good class to take, but I think if I was to go back and take it again, I would have signed up for it online. The course itself is really easy to learn just by using the textbook and other online resources.

I suggest more hands on activities in class. Sometimes just watching excel can be uninteresting. You should count attendance randomly on some days because the same students come to class and should be rewarded. I don't think we should have a cumulative exam though. It's just too much information.

This course definitely makes you think and encourages you to develop good studying habits. The course helps you analyze and view things in a different manner; it makes you take everything into consideration when making any decision or analyzing anything. Although the quizzes helped me review and test my knowledge of each chapter, I felt like the quizzes weren't very helpful in preparing for the exams. When I took the quizzes, I felt very confident in my understanding of the material but when it came time for the exams, I felt like I was very unprepared. I felt like the wording in the exams was nothing like the wording in the quizzes. I would have been helpful if there was a consistency between format and wording in the quizzes and tests. I also think that practice tests with similar problems and wording to that of the exams would have helped me better prepare for the actual exams. I also think that it would have been helpful if the exams had a longer amount of time or if they were not timed at all.

I believe more should be said in class. Less on blackboard I was confused the whole class.

1: Comment on the effectiveness of the instructor's classroom presentation and subject matter organization.

The Instructor had a unique way of presenting in class. He structured the class so that we can compute statistics both on excel and by hand. His slide were very helpful although his study guides were general and were not specific to the exams.

The material is organized and presented well. However, I felt that less emphasis should be put on learning how to work with Excel.
